OSHA ~ Visiting Many Nebraska Body Shops

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) has stepped up inspections of body shops nationwide and especially in Nebraska as part of a 3-year emphasis (until mid-2016) on protecting workers from isocyanate exposure.

Inspectors will check for a shop's chemical inventory, safety data sheets, Hazard assessment training and personal protection equipment (PPE). They will check the shop's OSHA 300 logs for five years and review worker's medical records. They will conduct interviews of employees and they will conduct air sampling and wipe sampling on skin and PPE - and even in areas such as drinking fountains or employee break rooms where other employees could be exposed to isocyanates if a painter, for example, sits down or touches items while still in a shoot suit or gloves. Shops are not exempt from inspections based on their use of waterborne basecoats or exemption from the EPA's "6H" or "NESHAP" rules implemented earlier this decade. Have you performed your GHS Training & 6H Training? Have you had Respirator Fit Testing? It's important to insure you are compliant and ready for OSHA to walk through your shop door.
